



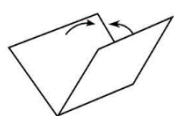

| Key Word | Meaning |
| Theme | The first main melody that you hear in a song. |
| Mood | Music that creates a relaxed feeling. |
| Ostinato | Repeated patterns in Music. |
| Orchestra | A group of instruments consisting of Strings, Brass, Percussion and Woodwind. |
| Dynamics | Volume in music. |
| Mickey Mousing | Matching movement to Music. |
| Cue Sheet | Document that lists all the musical elements of an audio/visual program. |
| Dissonance | Lack of harmony within the music. |
| Tempo | Speed of music. |
| Pitch | High or low notes in music. |
| Character | A person in a novel film or play. |
| Leitmotif | a recurring melody that accompanies the reappearance of an idea, person, or situation. |
| Scene | a sequence of continuous action in a play, film, opera, or book. |
